Italy

Lemon-yellow

Probably a hybrid of sour orange and citron (or lemon). It has been known in the Mediterranean for several centuries.

Season: Late Winter

Small to medium-large sized, depressed, round obovoid or broadly-pyriform. Rind is smooth, medium-thick.

Bouquet de Fleurs sour orange

USA

Light Orange

Parents unknown. Originally come from Florida.

Season: January to March

Standard and similar to other sour oranges but somewhat smaller and well-colored. Medium thick rind; sweet.

Cara Cara navel orange

Venezuela

Deep orange

A sport of Washington navel orange tree, discovered in 1976 at Hacienda Cara Cara in Venezuela.

Season: November to January

Slightly oblong shape. Normal textured rind. Reddish-pink seedless flesh. Rich taste with good acidity

Fukumoto navel orange

Japan

Reddish-orange

Originated by S. Fukumoto, from Kokawa-cho in Wakayama Prefecture.

Season: November to January

Seedless. Round shape. Normal rind texture and thickness. Has an excellent taste.

Goutoucheng sour orange (CRC 3929)

China

Yellow

Parents unknown. Comes from the Citrus Research Institute at Beibei, China.

Season: January to March

Yellow flesh and rind; large seeds; flesh is very sour; with a flattened bottom.

Goutoucheng sour orange (CRC 4004)

Gou Tou sour orange

China

Light-orange

Parents unknown. Originated in Liuzhou Academy of Agricultural Science, Guangxi, China.

Season: January to March

Large sized, yellow, round; very sour.

Indian sour orange hybrid

India

Medium orange

Parents unknown. Originated in Karnataka, India.

Season: December to March

Depressed, flat bottom, medium sized. Rind is thin. IT has a mandarin aroma, with some sour orange f

Kawano natsudaidai sour orange hybrid
Citrus natsudaidai

Japan

Golden orange yellow

Parents unknown. Thought to be originated from seed drifted ashore in Yamaguchi, Japan.

Season: February to April

Fruit is necked pummelo-shaped, medium is size. Rind is thick, rough, with distinct glands; juice vesicle

Keen sour orange

Orange

Parents unknown. Originated from under a Lisbon lemon tree planted in 1887.

Season: January to March

A typical sour orange. Juicy, moderate seeds, good taste.

Kharna sour orange hybrid

Citrus kharna Raf.(Kharna Khatta, Karna Nimbu, Khatta Nimbu)

India

Golden yellow to deep orange

Parents unknown. Probably a lemon or citron hybrid. Originated in Wandriker Farms, Poona, Maharashtra

Season: January to March

From medium to medium large size, form varies but usually round to oval; it has a broad and protuberant

Parents unknown. Originated on the place of A. P. Knight at Summerville, Addo in 1927.

Season: March to July

Seedless, medium-large, somewhat oblong fruit of excellent quality and medium-late maturity.
